Possible Openers:

- Why is it valuable to read an entire book of the Bible?
- Please read the passage together.
- What was something that was helpful, eye-opening, or difficult to understand from the message on Sunday?

Seeing the big picture:

- What tone did you hear as you listened to Colossians? (angry, happy, commending, correcting, etc)
- If you want to take the time, it would be valuable to read Ephesians straight through and then ask people to list all the similarities between Ephesians and Colossians.
- Below is a list of thoughts Paul shares to the church about being In Christ. Read through them again and then answer the following questions.

Deeply Rooted - how well do you know Christ?

- Deep hold of the deity of Christ Reverence and submission to Christ as preeminent
- Deep appreciation for the saving work of Christ.
- Deep commitment to know and live by God's Word.
- Deep commitment to Prayer dependence on Christ

Radically Changed (in every part of life) - how has He changed you?

- Radical Thanksgiving to Christ in all things
- Radical removal of the remnants of the old man
- including anger and it's results and sexual sins and their roots
- Radical love for the saints. Unity
- Radical desire to proclaim the gospel.
- Radical life of worship. Bring Christ glory in all things.
- Radical forgiveness.
- Radical and risky discipleship. servant leadership
- Why do you think both being rooted and changed are essential parts of living life IN Christ?
- What happens if you have one and not the other?
- Find at least one verse in Colossians for each of these.

- List the one that is most convicting to you for your life.
- Paul is writing this to a church. Therefore, how is our church doing at these 11 items? For each one, what is something we do as a church that supports living In Christ in that item? What are some ideas that Village could do for each item to help people be In Christ?
- How could you help a fellow believer in each of these things?
- Philemon puts into practice what Paul teaches in Colossians. Go through Philemon and see if you find evidence of any of these eleven themes.
- Why are these things vital for discipleship relationships? Which one is the most critical?
- Can you give an example of how you were discipled in some of these areas, or someone that set you a good example?
