Righteousness and Justice

Psalm 89:14 Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you.

Definitions:

God's Righteousness: God always does what is right, always conforms to His law, and is Himself the final standard of what is right.

God's Justice: The expression of His righteousness as He requires all to adhere to His standards of rightness and rewards or punishes accordingly.
