Self-Sufficiency

Definition: God is complete and does not any person or thing outside of himself for anything. There is nothing he needs, or ever will need.	
Exploring Self-Sufficiency: Acts 17:22-25; John 5:26	
1. God has always been and will always be and without need. (Is 43:7; Rev 4:11)	
2. Nothing is to God. (Psalm 50:12-15)	
Not necessary, but by His sovereign good	
3. Nothing can be added to God, yet we can Him and bring Him joy. (John 17:5; Is 62:3-5)	
4. God is to no one because He does not gain from us or need us – it is all His. (Rom 11:33-36)	
Implications and Response:	
1. Humble to the King – God doesn't need us, but we need Him and owe Him our service.	
2. The only one qualified to meet needs fully is the one who has of His own
